LAS includes a [Core Program](#) that provides the foundation for interdisciplinary knowledge and academic and methodological reflection.

The successful candidate will have teaching responsibilities in the LAS Core and contribute to curricular development and integration with other parts of the LAS program. The position has a teaching load of approximately 2 LAS courses per semester.

We expect

- an academic background in Psychology or a related Social Science, preferably with a PhD, at minimum a completed postgraduate qualification (M.A./M.Sc. level)
- research and teaching experience, with a focus on qualitative and quantitative methods as well as on research design
- near-native English and very good German
- excellent interpersonal skills and the willingness to engage with innovative teaching methods.

We offer you the opportunity to

- participate in an initiative that is breaking new ground for the University of Freiburg and has been receiving attention far beyond
- develop your teaching skills in an interdisciplinary, highly motivated, and supportive team
- contribute to a key area of the LAS curriculum
