for the Liberal Arts and Sciences (LAS) Program at UCF

Teaching Fellows commit to teaching a course in the LAS Program and receive financial compensation through a lectureship ("Lehrauftrag") or third-party funding ("Drittmittel"). We are especially looking for someone to teach

in the Environmental and Sustainability Sciences

undergraduate courses in summer term 2022 (or later) on e.g. Sustainable food transformation, Environmental governance, Sustainability sciences, Nature conversation, Sustainable city development, Hydrology and climate, Human-environment interrelation, Ecosystem (services), Methods such as Geographical information systems, field research, conducting interviews and surveys.

The LAS Program, under the supervision of an interfaculty Board of Studies, is the UCF flagship project. This four-year interdisciplinary course is the first program of its kind at a large German research university. **It is fully English-taught**.

Teaching Fellows **should hold a PhD or Master's Degree** in the Environmental Sciences or a related field, preferably have experience using quantitative and/or qualitative research methods and be enthusiastic about teaching. We provide you the opportunity to further develop your teaching skills with a highly motivated interdisciplinary group of students, in a flexible and supportive environment.

A Teaching Fellowship will cover 40 hours of teaching in semester long or half semester long courses at UCF. Typically, a **Teaching Fellowship comes with an award of 2000 €**, depending on the Fellow's seniority.
