

Call for Applications

Erasmus Prize for the Liberal Arts and Sciences 2025

The **Erasmus Prize** is awarded to scientific works that are exemplary in their interdisciplinary perspective and make a substantial contribution to bridging academic disciplines, such as the natural sciences and the humanities. The prize is awarded in two categories:

for Bachelor- and Master Theses for Dissertations and first Postdoc-Papers

The Erasmus Prize, funded by the Sparkasse Freiburg-Nördlicher Breisgau, comes with an **endowment** of 1,500 Euro for Bachelor- and Master Theses and of 3,500 Euro for Dissertations and first Postdoc-Papers.

The prize addresses **young researchers** from all fields and faculties of the University of Freiburg and from universities that cooperate with University College Freiburg in the area of Liberal Arts and Sciences. The academic work must be in English or German and must have been published or have undergone final examination after 1 January, 2024.

Applications must be submitted in the form of a nomination. **Nominations** can be submitted by professors of the University of Freiburg. Nominations from partner institutions should be addressed to Prof. Dr. Dr. h.c. mult. Hans-Joachim Gehrke, UCF Director of Outreach, at the address provided below.

Nominations must include a letter of reference, a summary of the thesis or paper (max. of 1000 words), the thesis or paper itself, as well as the candidate's CV. Nominations can be submitted until **1 February, 2025** to: **erasmus.prize@ucf.uni-freiburg.de**.
