Responsibilities, Reflections, and the Political under Conditions of »Post-Truth«

For this, researchers often build on concepts such as critique, ethics, responsibility, reflexivity, intervention or transformation. In doing so they often refer to feminist movements, queer, post- or decolonial thinking, or more general to notions of justice or the democratisation and diversification of science.

In the workshop, researchers from different disciplines will report on their work in which they attempt to go beyond conventional paradigms, methods, and research routines. The aim is to discuss the respective approaches and to explore the possibilities of productive relations between the social sciences and the life sciences.
