Sheila Jasanoff is Pforzheimer Professor of STS (Science and Technology Studies) at Harvard University (Kennedy School). She is a foundational figure of STS and a distinguished pioneer with her focus on the bearing of law on public reason and the entanglements between science, technology, politics and culture in contemporary democratic societies. She works on comparative politics and cross-cultural analyses of regulation, risk management and environmental decision-making, and the national, international, and global implications of scientific and technological change. This has made her a world leading and deeply influential public intellectual on the cultural forms of knowledge societies.
